The weather is getting cooler all the time and we had a few snowflakes last week. It's been quite clear out now and we get a good frost every night.

How is Tony coming along with the pheasant hunting? Hope he got a few and he sure ought to get a deer with the two week season. If I know Tony at all he'll get one anyway. Sure wish that I was home to get in a little of that hunting. Haven't gotten any mail lately so I don't know just how all the hunters at home are doing. But just like everything else here the mail service is poor, too. It's getting so it takes 10 or ~~12~~ days to get a letter from home. When I do get it tho I get 7 or 8 letters at a time so that's not too bad at all.

I got myself a new Smith and Wesson  
-38 now, too. Its a nice little weapon  
and just right for quick use.

I'll love again for now but until

love to all.
